NE! COLLITTEE TO BEAUTIFY AREA GROUNDS

Rather than a new committee this may be an old committee revised. At any rate the project has new blood and very enthusiastic blood at that.

(better known as "Pete") They have recognized the crying need for the clean up and beautification of what for the lack of a name has been called the "no-man's land" of our community. 35 SEVER TAPS AUTHORIZED By Hayne Comer

On November 4, 1959 another chapter was written with the long saga of the "citizens vs. The Pimmit Service Corporation".

The Fairfax County Board of Impervisors heard a petition on behalf of two applicants respectively asking for an authorization for a total of 85 new sever connections to the Pimmit Service Corp. Treatment Plant.

The applicants argued that since the state authorities had OK'd the 85 new connections, the County Supervisors had no legal right to deny the application.

Dr. Kennedy, appearing for the State and County Health Dept's, testified that he would not object to 35 new taps but that it was too early to gauge the possible effect or 85 new taps.

Mayne Comer, the Associations president and a local practicing attorney, appeared on behalf of the Ass'n and argued that the application should be denied on the grounds that the operation of the plant tended to be a public nuisance and thus the plant should not be allowed to expand.

Is. Comer produced about a dozen signed statements from adjacent residents critisizing the conditions created by the plant.

He also reminded the Board of the evidence and statistics which the Ass'n he presented in the past to defeat such applications.

Finally, the Board passed a resolution allowing just 35 taps but not specifying how frey were to be devided among the two developers applying for them.

It now appears that the County Boards has been the position that the State laws governing such installations have almost removed the matter from their jurisdiction.

ir. Comer feels that the time has come to attack this problem on the state level beginning with our deligates to the state legislature.

One this gis certain, the developers will be back before long with new applications for connections.


