Committee Reports .....

At the January meeting all committee chairmen of the Association will give summery reports of the year's activities.

Constitutional Amendments .....

Below are proposed amendments to the association Constitution and Ey-Laws. Please study them and be prepared to vote on them at this January meeting.

Constitution 055

- Article VI, Sec.(a) At the regular Jenuary March, recting, the President shall appoint a nominating and elections committee of at least three five whose duty it shall be to present to the Executive Committee members fifteen days prior to the May meeting a list of nominees for the position of President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Sergeant-at-Arms for the ensuing year, and at the same time publish said list of nominees in a newspaper of general circulation in Fairfax County as notice to the members. Each nominee shall be a member in good standing.
  - Sec.(b) At the Pebruary May, 1955 meeting, and each May meeting thereafter, subject to the report of the nominating and elections committee and nominations from the floor, all officers for the ensuing year shall be elected by ballot. A majority vote of members in good standing present and voting shall elect. After the 30th day of June 1955, the term of office for all officers shall be from the first day of July until the thirtieth day of June next following, at which time the successors shall take office.
  - Sec.(c) The District Representatives shall be elected at the regular August meeting each year during the month of May, 1955,

    1955, and each May thereafter, by a polling of the montars within each district, or at a special meeting convened by the Precident as seen thereafter as possible but in me case-later then the September meeting. Such slections shall be conducted by the District Representatives and a majority of members in good standing from in each district present and voting shall elect a representative from their district. The terms of office of the District Representatives shall coincide with those of the Officers.
- By-Laws
  Sec. 2 Meetings (a) The regular meetings shall be held on the first Tuesday of each every month, except duri the months of July and August.
  - (b) eginning with the calendar year 1955 and each year thereafter the annual meeting shall be the regular February May meeting.

Sec. 4 Expenditures (c) The annual budget shall be prepared by the Tressurer for approval at the March September, 1955 meeting and each September meeting thereafter, of the Association. Approval of the budget constitutes authority for the Tressurer to expend the budget. No other disbursements may be made without approval by the Association.

Sec.5 Dues

Dues shall be \$2.50 per house payable before I September of each year, and shall be due annually at the May meeting, and payable before the September meeting of the Association. The payment of \$2.50 shall entitle two adult members as described in Article III (a) of the Constitution to active membership.

(b) Persons applying for active membership after 1 Merek December first shall be entitled to active membership upon payment of one-half the dues charged regular dues.
