
Hello Neighbors!



Of course, make sure that when you're out there hanging your lights, you follow basic safety precautions. If you're up on a ladder, make sure it's on stable ground! Here's a few other basics:

- For outdoor light displays, only use lights that are meant for OUTDOOR use. Also, never use indoor extension cords on outdoor displays.
- Keep outdoor electrical connectors above ground and out of puddles and snow (wishful thinking!). When connecting light strands outside, wrap a plastic bag around the connections and tie the ends with waterproof tape.
- Make sure that cords do not cross walkways—it creates a tripping hazard.
- Check Christmas lights carefully for frayed or bare wires, cracked sockets, loose connections or damaged insulation.
- Connect no more than three strands together.
- Avoid overloading a single extension cord or outlet.
- Make sure that trees hung with lights are not touching power lines.
- For outdoor lighting, use an electrical outlet that is protected by a ground-fault circuitinterrupter. A GFCI is an outlet

- that shuts off the power if there is any leakage to ground -- that is, if electric current from the outlet is going anywhere except through the item plugged into the outlet.
- Use only insulated staples to hold strings in place, not nails, tacks or brads. Alternatively, you can use plastic hooks, gutter clips, fasteners, or soffit clips. If you can't find these where you buy your lights, try Home Depot – they sell some Velcro light clips that make putting the lights up and taking them down again very easy!
- Unplug lights before you go out or go to bed.

And just one more thing—burned homes have no curb appeal.

Neighbors, please protect yourself and your loved ones and install a smoke detector near your tree, or add new batteries in the one(s) you have and test it/them. Buy a household fire extinguisher and place it where it is easily accessible.

Now get creative! I hope you have fun creating some holiday curb appeal. I'm really looking forward to enjoying your display. Just remember to take the lights down at the end of the holiday season—holiday lights in February (or March, April, May...) certainly don't create curb appeal!

length and flower buds begin forming in the growing tips. If the night is illuminated during this critical period, the Poinsettia "thinks" that the day is longer than the night and does not form buds. When they are produced in the greenhouse, the natural day length brings them into bloom for the Christmas season. They are also provided with the abundant sunshine, the proper temperatures, the high fertilizer levels and the excessive blood, sweat and tears that

Poinsettias demand. So if you bring your poinsettia into the New Year pretty much intact, pat yourself on the back and don't feel guilty about decorating the garbage can with it on Monday.

And if you find yourself on the receiving end of winter-blooming bulbs such as Tulips, Hyacinths or Paperwhites, relax! These are easy to grow and easier to dispose of when they are finished. Just remember to keep them away from excess heat and don't let them dry out. When they're done, just toss 'em on the compost pile; like most bulbs they're not much good after being forced into early bloom. The Amaryllis bulb, on the other hand, deserves a commitment. With leafless stems topped with spectacular trumpet flowers, this one is worth



the trouble of keeping for years of winter bloom. And the variety of colors and forms is wonderful these days: from the traditional red to soft pinks to salmonorange to bi-colors and from frilly doubles to spidery miniatures. After flowering, long, fleshy strap-like leaves emerge; take care of these leaves and you will be rewarded in the next winter season. A little liquid fertilizer is a good thing, and when planting your patio pots in spring with petunias and marigolds, why not

add your leafed-out Amaryllis instead of a Dracaena spike? When the time comes in fall to add Mums to the pots, remove the Amaryllis, pot it up and set it in the basement where it can go dormant in peace. Water it sparingly to keep it from drying out completely and remove the leaves as they yellow. After a rest period a new flower bud emerges, and it's time to enjoy these beauties again.

Hopefully, with this bit of advice, your living Holiday presents will live longer than poor "Hammy," even, perhaps, into the next year and beyond.■



# Pimmit<sub>Hills</sub> Gardener

remember a Christmas few years back when I was just four or five years old and Santa brought us a hamster in a small wire cage. As I remember, I fed "Hammy" a raisin and the next morning he was dead. I know, not a very good Holiday story... but a lesson to be learned: give a kid a hamster or

give a kid raisins, but not both.

Anyway, there's not much I can do about the hamster now, but perhaps a few words of advice can avert a similar tragedy at your house when someone walks through the door with a Christmas Poinsettia or Amaryllis bulb.

First off, most of your Holiday plants are tropical and will not enjoy being left in the trunk or back seat of the car in the cold. Okay, so how cold is cold? Let's try to keep them in the 50's, the upper 40's at the coolest. And once home, don't let them dry out. Poinsettias and



Christmas Cacti (one cactus, two cacti...yeah, that's right ... but it's not really a cactus at all) are brought-up in a loving, humid atmosphere with plenty of TLC and liquid fertilizer, and the average house has a hard time measuring-up. So keep these plants away from heat vents, water when the top inch or so of soil feels

dry. Situate them in good, bright light, but out of the hot afternoon sun. And make sure that the pot can drain — over-watering is the number one killer of Poinsettias in the home.

Poinsettias that survive the season can easily be kept as leafy, green potted plants through the summer, but getting them to bloom again for the Holidays is another story. Shortly after the autumnal equinox (that's when the days are as long as the nights in September), the Poinsettia "reads" the shorter day
