

Hello Neighbor! What a spectacular summer for Pimmit Hills! I've noticed many of my neighbors outside boosting their home's curb appeal—I've seen everything from new siding to new porches to fresh paint to new flowers. You folks have been hard at work this summer, and it looks GREAT!

All that heat and humidity has been working hard too-on your home's exterior, particularly on your roof and siding. Your roof may not be the most exciting feature of your home, but it certainly is the most important! Siding usually gets a little more attention, but only from a distance. Taking time to do some simple maintenance will lengthen the life of your roof and siding, and of course, increase your home's curb appeal.

Let's take it from the top-the roof, that is. Do you have dark brown or black stains on your roof? Has the entire roof darkened to a dismal shade of black? It could be roof fungus, a vicious little critter that literally eats the tar right out of your asphalt shingles. (The technical term is saprophytic fungus.) It takes them a while, but their appetite eventually spells disaster for your roof. The dark fungus also ab-

sorbs more heat from the sun than your lighter shingles do, which translates to higher utility bills. What can you do? Don't scrub-it's hard on the shingles, and way too much work. The best way to get rid of the fungus is with a cleaner formulated specifically for roofs. One brand is ROOFCLEAN, which is biodegradable, won't harm your plants or grass, and is pretty easy to use. Mix as directed, spray it on, wait 30-40 minutes, and hose it off. (If you're feeling particularly lazy, you can let the next rainstorm rinse it off.) It even prevents regrowth of the fungus for up to 4 years. This and similar products are available at hardware stores like Ace and TrueValue, as well as Wal-Mart and through Sherwin Williams. Remember, safety first! If you don't like heights, or can't climb up on your roof, call a professional or a handyman. Your roof will thank you for it by lasting longer and looking like new!

What about the siding? Well, you wash yourself, your dog, your car-some of you even hose off the driveway and sidewalk-why not give your house a bath too? First walk around the entire house, inspecting the caulking around win-

dows, and replace it if necessary. Make sure all your siding is firmly in place too. Then wash it like you would your car-gently, with a mild soap, and hose it off-gently! A soft bristle brush on an extendable pole (like the kind available to reach the tops of vans and trucks) works great at getting any mildew or algae spots off. Just be careful when rinsing-make sure you don't spray up under the siding! Aim at the top and let the water run down. And if that all sounds like too much work. you can always hire a pro or a handyman to get the job done.

The finishing touch-windows. So, you think clean windows aren't necessary to home maintenance? Well, washing your windows should include inspecting them as well. You know how you never notice that little ding in your front

fender until you wash your car?
Same with windows. Getting up close and personal with your windows will allow you to take a good look at their condition, and make any repairs necessary. Don't forget to check your screens for places that need repair and make sure the "weep holes" (if you have them) on your windows or storm windows are clear and draining properly. Washing the windows will let in more light, and will make your home sparkle on the outside.

A bright, new-looking roof, squeaky-clean siding, and sparkling windows-it all adds up! It will give your home a fresh appearance at relatively low cost. It's just one more way to enhance the value of your home, and increase its curb appeal!



Record numbers of readers participated in the 2002 Summer Library Program, in which students read either fifteen or eight books, depending on grade level. Community Events at Area Church

St. Luke's United Methodist Church in Pimmit Hills is offering a variety of religious studies, youth activities, live music and health information for the community.

St. Luke's, at 7628 Leesburg Pike in Falls Church, traditionally draws many of its members from the Pimmit Hills area. All of their activities are open to everyone and you need not be a member of the church to participate.

Sunday, Sept. 8 is the debut of the church's fall schedule and that day's worship at 11 am will commemorate Sept. 11, 2001. Rev. Gretchen Miller, St. Luke's pastor, says representatives of fire, police and military services are expected to participate in the service. The congregation hopes that its Pimmit Hills neighbors will join in this service to remember the heroism and the sacrifices of that day.

A Christian pop concert by the Cal Jammers begins at 1 pm on Sunday, Sept. 8, after the special worship service. Food is available from 1 pm until 3 pm and kids can play games and win prizes.

A new Bible study will meet in the home of a Pimmit Hills resident starting Wednesday, Sept. 11. The study, which focuses on friendships, will last six weeks and will meet from 6:30 pm until 8:30 pm each Wednesday.

The church's youth group begins its fall meetings on Wednesday,

Sept. 11, at 7 pm. The youth group welcomes anyone in grades seven through 12 and interested youth can simply drop in at the first meeting. This fall's activities are still being planned but past youth activities have included lock-ins, concerts, ski trips, charity walks and other service projects.

St. Luke's English as a Second Language (ESL) classes, which have helped nearly 200 people improve their English, will continue this fall. Registration is Saturday, Sept. 14 and classes begin Saturday, Sept. 21. The church is looking for ESL teachers; no previous training is necessary—the church provides training.

A health fair on Nov. 2 will give Pirmmit Hills residents one-stop access to tests such as blood pressure readings and bone density checks. The health fair also will provide information on basic health issues.

Pimmit_{Hills} Gardener

The fireflies have been spectacular this summer. Sitting out on thedeck in the evening, I watched as they ascended into the tree tops, blinking a sort of "love Morse code" as they went. Fireflies use their bioluminescence to attract members of the or

attract members of the opposite sex. When the girl firefly likes the light show, she signals to the boy firefly and, well, the sparks fly.

The enzyme that causes these little beetles to light up is aptly named "Luciferase." The eggs and larvae are also luminescent. The larval stage is spent in the layer of organic debris at the soil surface, feeding on earthworms, snails and slugs. (Mmmm, yum!) Most adult fireflies eat pollen and nectar from flowers, if they eat anything at all. There are a few cannibalistic species which mimic other fireflies' flash patterns to attract amorous males to their last supper.

Unfortunately, today's landscape maintenance habits are not helping the firefly. Bagging lawn clippings and raking flower beds clean leave no place for fireflies to hide. Outdoor lighting actually



competes with the firefly's light display, leaving the poor little guys lonely and probably a bit envious. Also, pesticides can kill off both the firefly larvae and their dinner.

The use of pesticides, especially non-specific

sorts like the outdoor foggers, kill off more than just the offensive pest. Predators, which help to maintain the balance of power in the garden, are also affected.

And, with the predators out of the way, the surviving pests (and there will always be survivors) come back in a big way. In the spring, especially after a mild winter, the aphid population always seems to get out to an early lead. But if you wait a bit (why arrive at the party before the buffet is spread out?), the ladybugs and their larvae (black comma-shaped critters with orange spots) will soon be out in force to keep the aphids in check. If you apply pesticides and kill off the aphids, there will be nothing for the emerging ladybugs to eat. They will leave your party for the one down the block -- they are very loval to

good hosts -- leaving you with a whole new crop of aphids to contend with. And healthy, happy plants are surprisingly resilient, taking insect damage in stride. And think about how much more interesting the garden is with

butterflies sailing from one blossom to the next in search of nectar. If you kill off the caterpillars, you won't have butterflies. Instead go to the other end of the spectrum and grow plants just for the caterpillar's supper.

Members of the Umbel family, such as dill, parsley, carrots and fennel, make great dining for the swallowtail larvae. (Watch for caterpillars banded in black, yellow and green.) Tuck in a few cabbages or mustard plants (or leave last winter's ornamental cabbage to go to seed) to feed the cabbage butterfly's young. And don't forget the nectar plants for the adults. These are usually flat-topped flower clusters or daisy-type flowers, but also include trumpet-shaped blossoms.

During a dry summer when noncultivated flowers are scarce, my flower gardens and wildflower meadow are busier than Grand Central Station, attracting butterflies, bees and hummingbirds, searching for nectar and pollen.

The only active insect control I have in my yard is a pair of wrens, feeding their second brood of



youngsters in the birdhouse mounted over the kitchen window. Well, that's not completely accurate. There's also have a pair of house sparrows nesting in the house hung in the Red Maple (Acer rubrum). And there

are the catbirds who love the thick, woodsy vegetation of the backyard and the cardinals who come to drink at the "creek". Out front in the meadow, the song sparrows patrol the grasses looking for insects.

Did you know that the hummingbirds that come for the nectar of the Trumpet Creeper Vine (Campsis radicans), the Beebalm (Monarda didyma) and the Cardinal Flower (Lobelia cardinalis) also eat aphids and other small insects? And the dragonfly is the enemy of the mosquito; the backyard pond attracts dragonflies, though its moving waters and perpetually hungry goldfish keep it from becoming a mosquito nursery.

So the next time you reach for a container of pesticide, think about all the other creatures you will be impacting, including yourself. Instead of poisoning our outdoor living rooms, let Mother Nature do her thing and let's return to the eloquent equilibrium that she designed.
