Next up, the 3T bus stop by Route 7 and Pimmit Drive will be moved by Metro to a spot further on Pimmit to make that corner a little safer. The move is planned for some time within the next month.

Traffic Calming Recommendations Needed

This summer, the Pimmit Hills Citizens Association (PHCA) was informed by Fairfax County that three of our streets are eligible for inclusion in the county's traffic calming program.

Pimmit Drive, Lisle Avenue and **Griffith Road** are all eligible for traffic calming measures, which could include additional stop signs, additional signage, highlighted crosswalks, or cut-through restrictions.

These three roads were identified as eligible based recent Traffic Calming Studies conducted by the county.

For example, on Pimmit Drive (at Griffith Road) a study was conducted on Friday, May 5, 2010.

The speed limit on this road is 25 MPH and the study concluded:

• 1,382 cars traveled northbound with an average speed of 35 MPH • 738 cars traveled southbound with an average

speed of 30 MPH The study also found that **15 percent** of cars were going:

- Faster than 43 MPH northbound, and
- Faster than 39 MPH southbound.

PHCA had formed a task force to recommend what measures should be requested.

The task force is currently seeking feedback on what our community thinks would be effective traffic calming measures and where they are most needed.

The task force will compile the feedback and present recommendations at the September 7 PHCA meeting.
