

New Footpath Planned to West Falls Church Metro Station

Pimmit Hills residents might of the security fence besoon enjoy faster bike and tween the SI Yard and I-66 pedestrian access to the West Falls Church metro station, if a new WMATA proposal to build a path on Idylwood Road gets legs.

The project-which would include constructing a new pedestrian/cyclist bridge across Pimmit Run watershed on Redd Road—could cut the walking distance for residents by up to one mile and eliminate the need to walk along Route 7.

At Fairfax County's request for improved pedestrian access to Metorail, WMATA has conducted a feasibility study for "a pedestrian/bike trail connecting the Pimmit Hills neighborhood to the north entrance of the West Falls Church Station."

"The entrance to the trail would be located on the Idlywood Road and will follow the path

right-of-way."


The dark line on the map to the right shows the approximate location of the proposed north side pedestrian access to West Falls station.

Currently, direct Pimmit Hills pedestrian access to the metro and to Idylwood is cut by the Pimmit Run watershed that crosses

Redd Road (shown by the arrow on the map to the right).

As part of the proposal, officials have suggested adding a pedestrian/cyclist-only bridge to join Pimmit Hills to Idvlwood Road and the new path to the metro.
