





Our January meeting was packed full of Association business.
Here are some of the highlights.

1st Vice President Bill Niland alerted the group to recent articles about identity theft. Here are some steps you can take to minimize the risk. 1) Order a copy of your credit report from each of the three major credit bureaus once a year. Checking your report on a regular basis allows you to catch mistakes and fraud before they wreak havoc. 2) Deposit outgoing mail in post office boxes, rather than in an unsecured mailbox.

If you've been a victim of identity theft, call the Federal Trade Commission's Identity Theft Hotline toll-free at 1-877-IDTHEFT (438-4338). More information can be found on the FTC's web site at http://www.consumer.gov/idtheft/.

The Shepherd's Center of Vienna contacted President Baker to see if there was interest in starting a group in the Hills. What is The Shepherd's Center? It is a not-for-profit interfaith organization serving older persons in Northern Virginia. More information can be found on their web site: http://www.scov.org/. You can also con-

tact President Baker for further information.

In development news, the Fair-fax County Board of Supervisors voted Jan. 6 to approve the West*Group's re-zoning request mentioned in the last Dispatch. 
<u>Visualize</u>-See whatever situation may be potentially stressful. Recreate this situation and practice how you will react in a manner that will be beneficial.

As with asphalt, occasionally small cracks will develop, but these are fairly easy to fix if attended to right away. If the top layer begins to chip off, repair becomes a bit more complicated, but it can be remedied by resurfacing. Other than that, the occasional power-washing is all you need to keep your concrete driveway looking brand new!

Chip-and-tar is similar to asphalt. If you don't like the flat-black look of asphalt, this might be the choice for you! Also, chip-and-tar driveways do not require the periodic liquid sealer that asphalt driveways do. Chip-and-tar is pretty simple-hot liquid asphalt is laid on a compacted gravel base, and chips of stone are embedded into it and rolled smooth. The rough surface provides great traction - a good idea if your driveway is on a hill! The color varies with the color of stone chips used, and different colors can be blended to create a custom look. Another similar look is a gravel driveway - easily maintained by adding more gravel as necessary. However, gravel needs to be kept it in its place-ragged edges detract from the overall look, so you'll have to tidy up the edges periodically. Since it can't be swept clean, you'll have to pick off leaves and twigs by hand or with a blower. And of course, if you like getting your exercise by shoveling snow off the driveway, then gravel is not for you!

Paving stones or blocks are by far the most durable and long-lasting type of driveway. Think about itthe ancient Romans used pavers for their roads - and some of those roads still exist!! Pavers also provide endless design possibilities - from size, shape and color of the blocks themselves to the pattern in which they're laid out. Unfortunately, beauty and strength have a pricepavers are also one of the most expensive options for your driveway. But there is a less expensive option-stamped concrete! This kind of driveway is installed in the same way as a traditional concrete driveway, but is then stamped with a mold to look like individual paver blocks. A wide variety of patterns and block shapes and the fact that the concrete can easily be colored to mimic natural stone or brick make stamped concrete a good choice if you like the look of pavers but your wallet doesn't.

Whatever we choose, our new driveway will certainly add to the value of our home. Not only will it provide off-street parking, a beautiful new driveway—or a well-maintained one—shows pride of ownership and boosts a home's curb appeal. Well, time to get back to my armchair!

vears hybridizers have brought other species into the mix to reduce the size to a shrubby tree and, more importantly, to delay the bloom and often avoid brownouts (when freezing temps of early spring turn flowers to mush). An even earlier blooming the Star species, Magnolia (M. stellata) can often be saved from devas-

tating freezes by siting this smaller shrub-like tree in a cold, shaded spot such as the north side of a building to delay full bloom. The most common selection is 'Royal Star', a lovely sight when covered with pure white, spidery flowers. Pink forms, such as 'Rosea', are also available though these tend to fade out to just a blush of pink in full bloom. I grow both of these at my parents' house.

The latest craze among plant nuts partial to Magnolias (though I must admit that I don't have one of these <u>yet</u>) are the yellow-flowered hybrids, such as 'Butterflies', 'Elizabeth', and 'Yellow Bird'. These April to May bloomers get their lovely soft yellow color from our native Cucumbertree (M. acuminata), a 50 to 80-foot giant that blooms in late spring. These dwarfed hybrids bloom before the leaves emerge but after the late



freezes, making them much more of a sure thing for spring display.

Also leafless in winter and grown more for the shock value of its oversized foliage, is the Bigleaf Magnolia (M. macrophylla). With hound-dogear leaves in the 12 to 32-inch range, this Southeast native lends a tropical atmosphere to the

landscape. For the smaller garden search for the closely related Ashe Magnolia (M. ashei), another native topping out at only 20 feet (I have one just off the patio). Both of these big-leaf trees produce big (up to a foot across) white blossoms in June reminiscent of the Southern Magnolia (M. grandiflora). You may have to search the specialty catalogs or native plant sales to find these beauties.

And speaking of the Southern Magnolia, no other plant reminds me of the South like this one. This stately evergreen tree does not venture much farther north than our area, at least not willingly. Selections have been made to extend the range of the Southern Magnolia, but to grow a really grand tree, one must live here in the South. And, as the Latin name suggests, this grand tree has grand flowers — big, white, fleshy blossoms held against the

Reproducible forms and instructions (Federal and Virginia) will also be available, and if you can't find the one you need, ask at the information desk; library staff may be able to download a copy for you from the internet.

Tysons-Pimmit also hosts volunteers who provide free tax counseling on some Wednesday evenings and Saturday mornings. Currently, sessions are offered through February; check with the library for exact times and locations. Assistance is limited to those with basic tax returns, to those with limited income, and/or the elderly, disabled, or to those with limited English language skills. Other events to watch for at the library: on February 5, a free program will be offered introducing the internet to web "newbies". The program begins at 10:30 a.m. bring your questions! The sequel to this program, scheduled for March 5, is the very popular "Finding it on the Web" program, at 2 p.m. A variety of children's programming is also planned, including a puppet show on March 15, plus other activities that you can learn more about in the library's monthly calendar, available at all branches. 

have one question: will this winter ever end? I know, I know, by the calendar it's only a few weeks old (as I write this), but I'm sick and tired of winter. We've had enough snow and plenty of cold already. I want spring and I want it now!

There, I feel better already. I should go look for Crocuses in the front yard. Crocuses always help beat back the

winter blahs. And the Magnolias help, too, especially the Star and Saucer Magnolias with their fat fuzzy buds promising the biggest and earliest spectacles of spring.

The Magno-

lias are a fantastic group of trees. They have inhabited the earth for millions of years. Evolving before traditional pollinators such as bees, wasps, butterflies and moths, Magnolias still rely on their ancient partner, the beetle, to pollinate their magnificent flowers. And most produce a powerful scent and plenty of pollen to draw the beetles in. Native to southeast Asia and the

southeastern U. S., the various species and hybrid Magnolias are right at home in our mid-Atlantic landscapes. Most prefer a moist, organic soil and some will be right at home in wet, even swampy situations.

The deciduous, spring-blooming Magnolias are the showiest of the lot. Most of these are the result of the hybridizing of Asian species that began almost two centuries ago

> when a Frenchman named
> SoulangeBodin crossed
> the whiteflowered Yulan
> Magnolia (M.
> denudata) with
> the purple Lily
> Magnolia (M.
> liliiflora). This
> resulted in the

Saucer Magnolias (M. x soulangiana), a group of trees in the 20 to 30-foot tall range with flowers appearing on bare branches in early spring and ranging from white through the pinks into wine purple. I have the ivory-white 'Lennei Alba' and the deep wine-purple 'Burgundy', they bloom their heads off each spring despite their young age. In recent
