Whether you want information about what's going on in the community, or just a chance to mix and mingle with your neighbors and enjoy an evening treat, the PHCA meeting has something for everyone. 

gone and tossing them on the compost pile. To get them to rebloom the next year they must get full sun and the tops must be allowed to yellow at their own pace. I'd rather get them out and get on with the summer annuals. (And this way I get to change colors every year!) If you want a tulip that's more perennial in nature, pick "Emperor" tulips (aka "Fosteriana"), or one of the many species tulips such as "Gregii" and "Kauffmanii" tulips (look for the Latinized names) and plant

them in full sun. And if you're lucky enough to have a cool, unheated garage, pot up a dozen or so tulip bulbs in a large pot, then stow them in the garage until they start to sprout in March. Then add some spring pansies and keep them out of the hot sun. Once buds show set the pot out for all the neighbors to envy!ca


Pimmit Hills Gardener

um's the word! Chrysanthemums are a colorful fall staple, but they don't always make it through the winter. Florist mums are usually too wimpy to take our winters, so look for "hardy mums" for the garden. If planted out while still in tight

bud and mulched well, they are more likely to survive until spring. When they begin to sprout in April, transplant if needed, and then keep them pinched back (by nipping off half of the new growth every few weeks) until the Fourth of July. With a bit of fertilizer and lots of sun, you'll have a repeat performance next fall.

For tough, winter-hardy posies, plant pansies. And plant plenty of them. These jewels of spring actually do better when planted in the autumn and, by April, will spread a lovely carpet under tulips planted at the same time. With so many wonderful shades to choose from now, you can easily coordinate



Before you pop those pansies in the

ground, think about adding some tulips to the picture. Try planting the bulbs in clusters of five or six in the space of a large dinner plate and then set the pansy plants in between the tulip clusters -- you'll get a grander show from fewer bulbs by grouping them instead of lining them up in a row. While you're at it, you can top each tulip bulb cluster with an ornamental cabbage or kale (same thing, basically). By spring clean-up the cabbage plants will be ready for the compost as the tulips sprout right through the old rootball.

I treat most tulips like annuals, pulling them out after the bloom is
