Even smaller, 'Pocomoke' comes in at 20 inches tall and is covered with deep rosepink flowers. Check the Arboretum's website for a listing of all two dozen hybrid introductions.

Crape Myrtles are easily grown in full sun and well-drained soil. Keep in mind that they are one of the last plants to sprout leaves in the spring-we're not dead, just slow to wake up! And Crapes are fast growing. This trait often leads to them being butcher pruned each spring, This cutting back to large stumps leads to a proliferation of new shoots that end up weak and leggy. Pruning should be done only in late winter or spring, never earlier, and should be selective rather than wholesale. Remove entire branches back to the main trunk. They can even be kept to a single trunk, though this is against their multi-trunk nature. If your Crape is too big, the best bet is to replace it with one of the new varieties that attains the desired size (check your nursery or garden center's Dirr manual under Lagerstroentia). Starting with the appropriate variety and then properly pruning from an early age will result in a Crape Myrtle that fits the available space. I grow a couple of the dark cherry-red 'Victor' Crape Myrtles in a perennial bed -at four to five feet in height, they fit right in. Try the dwarf 'Pocomoke'

Crape in front of the mounding and evergreen 'Soft Touch' Japanese Holly for a tough, colorful and low shrub border. One of the taller varieties such as 'Choctaw' will become a colorful, high canopy, shading the patio nicely through the summer.

On another subject, the brown branch tips on your trees are the result of the cicadas. What a show they gave us! My husband, a Michigan native, was fascinated by his first encounter with the newly emerged critters: all pale gold except for their beady red eyes! This was my third time and I took the time (finally) to appreciate these marvels of nature ... at least until the dog started eating them like they were kibble! Anyway, the egg-laying process caused the branches to die and we're left with the clean up job. The trees will recover, but if yours weren't in the best shape to start with, consider creating a good sized mulched area under the tree this fall using the fallen leaves. (Run them through the lawn mower to chop them up if you like or top them with a thin layer of wood chips.) The leaves will break down and leach nutrients and organic matter into the soil very quickly and are much better than chemical fertilizers. Organic matter rules!

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Scooters and Mopeds

From the July 12, 2004 Fairfax County Board of Supervisors Meeting:

......Chairman Connolly stated that law enforcement today is facing the problem of the proliferation of small gas-powered mini-motorcycles known as "pocket bikes" and gas-powered scooters. Motorized scooters resemble the push scooter of old except for the engine mounted over the back wheel.

Existing codes prohibit children under 16 from operating these on public roads, but many parents are unaware of this law. There are children on County roadways operating these scooters in excess of 20 miles per hour. He asserted that this is dangerous for not only the operator, but also for pedestrians and other drivers.

Chairman Connolly said that the Police Department is developing a brochure which will present a comprehensive review of existing legislation so that stores selling mopeds and scooters, parents, operators, and police officers will be aware of the laws that govern their use.

Unfortunately, the police must deal with a myriad of often confusing and overlapping codes. He stated that the County needs legislation that is up-to-date, clear, consistent, and easily understood by buyers, dealers, and the police.

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No Place Like

HOME

New column about home improvement in Plmmit Hills by PHCA Second Vice President:

Since roofs are one of the most dominate features on homes, it's important that they not only look good for curb appeal, but they are doing a good job protecting the home. An old roof can let in water and insects (equals rot!), which can greatly damage a house. Signs to look for in a roof that needs to be replaced are curling of the shingles, mold and moss growing on the roof, shingles that are falling off and excessive amount of roof grit in the gutters.

Unless you see the above signs, you probably are nowhere near close to needing to get new roofing. But if you do get your roof professionally looked at, be sure to get at least three opinions. Ask friends and neighbors for word-of-mouth recommendations on contractors that they've used and been satisfied with.

Standard roofs, most common on Pimmit Hills homes, are three-tab shingles that have a 20 year guarantee. More expensive roofs can have a lifetime guarantee. More homes in Pimmit Hills are starting to use architectural shakes which have a more depth than normal flat shingles. These add beauty and value to the house and last longer.

The most important part of getting a new roof—or making sure your existing roof has—is proper ventilation. Gable vents most common to Pimmit Hills houses are not good enough. Our attics get too hot and humid which eventually can reduce the life of the roofing material. Be sure your contractor installs eave and ridge vents to ensure constant convection. Ideally, roofs should have an overhang with venting. The overhang helps keep water away from the house.

Because we live in a neighborhood of wonderful large trees, often our roofs get stained by the leaves and debris. While it looks bad, the best thing to do is try to keep the roof generally free of debris if you can (if you can't, that's okay too), especially in roof valleys. Pressure washing the roof will only cause premature aging of the roof.

With all our trees, it's important to keep the gutters clean. Gutters full of leaves, acoms and debris will allow water to get up and under your roof and into the walls plus water will not drain properly through drain pipes but run down the siding of your house. And here's a helpful hint: a sign your gutters really need help is if you have trees and plants growing in them!
