The owners of the Commons Apartments, which are situated at the NW corner of Magarity Road and Anderson Road in McLean (between the gas station and Magarity Road, to the right of Westgate Elementary), have submitted plans to Fairfax County to redevelop the land into 232 residential units (townhomes and condos with parking garages).
